On The Green

Winter is always an interesting season here on the High Desert. Everything can change quickly as we went from beautiful December golfing weather to below zero temperatures and freezing rain. December allowed a large number of rounds to be played on the courses and the wear and tear was starting to really show up on the greens and from repeated cart traffic. Just because it is the off season and any golf weather is good golf weather doesn't mean cart traffic should go everywhere to make the round easier, quicker, and warmer. While it would seem to be a minor deal to drive on dormant turf it does have a long-term affect and slows the recovery process in the spring. The repeated use of shortcuts for the shotgun starts and following the well-worn path of fellow golfers is visually apparent for the short term and agronomically apparent well into the growing season. Your help would be appreciated in observing standard golf cart etiquette around green and tee complexes by

using and parking on cart paths.

Golf maintenance has learned over the years to minimize damage to the course with ropes where needed, rotating pin positions and committing to having small areas of the tee boxes be severely damaged versus the whole tee box suffering significant damage, and using walking days only when justified. The mats are no one's favorite on the par three holes but if they are used then damage is restricted and spring recovery is 4-6 weeks quicker. Moving tee markers as you play only expands the damage and recovery time and once again MATS.

Pin positions are rotated every 10-14 playing days amongst the previously established positions and the ability to cut new pin placements is not an option with the frozen turf. Please keep in mind that it is the middle of winter in Central Oregon and course conditions will reflect the season. As we progress through the winter season and into early spring the need to protect the courses becomes more of a priority as we try and balance accessibility to the courses without a long-term detriment to conditions and delaying recovery. It takes very little moisture to create damaging conditions when the soil is frozen or just thawing the top half inch so cart use will be monitored and restricted as needed. The days are getting longer and spring will arrive bringing whatever it feels like on a given day but more sunshine always makes it a better day.



2024 Annual Pass Info

2024 Annual Pass updates

Annual Pass information will be released shortly to our website at www.eaglecrestgolforegon.com Everyone is encouraged to view the information on the "golf passes" tab. There you can print the registration form that you'll sign and return to the golf shop. This update pertains to the 2024 Annual Pass that begins March I and runs through February 28th of 2025. Below we've highlighted a few of the changes being incorporated for 2024:

- When you submit your registration the golf shop staff will be taking your picture to place in our system. This will help accelerate the learning curve for our new staff members and assist us in keeping imposters off the courses.
- All annual pass levels now come with complimentary range balls (one bucket per day).
- Silver pass holders may play in the winter shotguns that begin before Noon, every day.
- Stone Creek in Portland has been added to our course list for reciprocals (Platinum & Gold).
- Tee times by phone will be limited to just 7 days in advance.
- Tee times made online will be available 21 days out for Platinum and 14 days for all other passes.

Your GHIN handicap not only enables participation in a variety of open competitions but also grants you exclusive access to the USGA GHIN app. This app boasts features like GPS tracking, stat analysis, and the convenience of posting your scores directly from your phone.

Exciting updates await you in 2024:

9-Hole Scores Inclusion: Beginning this year, your 9-hole scores will now count towards your handicap the very next day. No more waiting for the combination of nine-hole scores!

10-17 Hole Scores Flexibility: For those instances when you play between 10 and 17 holes, a new feature allows the use of the expected Score Differential. This enhancement provides greater flexibility in score posting, with a focus on hole-by-hole scoring.

Shorter Course Eligibility: Embracing diversity in course lengths, the new regulations include courses as short as 750 yards for 9 holes and 1,500 yards for 18 holes for course rating and slope rating eligibility.
