3. Bad Days Happen-Keep Swinging:





COURSE MAINTENANCE

Some stretches of abnormally warm weather have accelerated the season for our golf courses and created some beautiful stretches of days for enjoying the sun and green grass. Every piece of equipment that can mow grass is being utilized along with additional days and hours for our staff to try and keep up with the turf growth. The turf loves these warm days as much as you do and is growing at a remarkable pace right now. Part of our capital expenditure this year is another rough mower to help us get everything mowed twice a week. The capital expenditures for this year just wrapped up with the structural work needed and painting of the pavilion, storage shed and propane enclosure. This vear also included overlayed cart paths on the Ridge course from 4 green to 5 tee and 7 green to 8 tee. Besides the rough mower an additional greens triplex mower has been added to our fleet.



The Resort course is undergoing improvements with funding for drainage and sprinkler replacements on hole 11, along with adding topsoil and seeding. Improvements are already visible, and patience is appreciated as cart traffic is restricted on seeded areas. Two staff members, Derin Abbott (5 years) and Chase Enoch (25 years), will leave on May 30th, leading to staff role shifts and promotions. Seasonal staff are returning, allowing for better maintenance of golf facilities. Optimism is expressed for a summer free of extreme temperatures and smoke.

Online Tee Time Reservations for Annual Pass Holders

As an annual pass holder, you can easily book your tee times online using your credentials from the golf shop management system. To check available slots, please visit [www.eaglecrestgolforegon.com]

(http://www.eaglecrestgolforegon.com), go to the "tee-times" section, and select "Annual Pass." Don't forget to sign in at the top right corner to update your account details if necessary.

Key Details:

- Booking window now defaults to 1 Player not 4 Reminder to change to appropriate # of players when searching for your tee time.
- Reservation Timeline:
- Platinum pass holders can reserve tee times 21 days in advance.
- Other pass holders can reserve tee times 14 days in advance.
- Phone reservations are limited to 7 days ahead.
- Credit Card Requirement:

A credit card is required to prevent "no-shows," with fees applicable as per your signed agreement. The golf shop may waive fees for unforeseen circumstances, but repeated violations will incur charges.

Punch Pass Users:

Punch pass users can make online tee times through a public portal for an additional booking fee or can call for reservations 7 days in advance without incurring fees.

Additional Guidelines:

• Dogs on Course:

Only service dogs are permitted on the course; casual dogs are not allowed to ensure the cleanliness of the area and safety of our guests.

• Pace of Play:

Aim for 2 hours and 15 minutes for nine holes on championship courses and **3 hours and 15 minutes on the Challenge Course. Frequent players should target under 4 hours on Ridge and Resort courses and under 3 hours on the Challenge Course.

• Alcohol Policy:

Outside alcohol is not permitted; all beverages must be purchased through Eagle Crest outlets in accordance with Oregon liquor laws.
